WORKFORCE INSTITUTE

UPO's Workforce Institute is a non-degree educational institution licensed in the District of Columbia that offers a wide variety of job training programs designed to help adults earn industry-recognized professional certifications and become engaged members of the modern workforce.

The UPO Workforce Institute is comprised of three divisions:

Vocational Job Training offers comprehensive training programs in culinary arts, information technology, commercial driving, emergency medical services, and hospitality.

Construction & Trade Skills Training offers classroom instruction and hands-on training in telecommunication, electrical work, and professional building maintenance.

Job Readiness & Placement offers interview preparation, resume writing, job assistance and placement, and referrals to other support services.

UPO Workforce Institute's job training programs and placement services are open to income-eligible DC residents. Financial assistance and other resources may be available to qualifying candidates to participate in our fee-based courses.

ELECTRONIC BENEFIT TRANSFER (EBT) PROCESSING

Washington, DC residents who have been prequalified by the DC Department of Human Services can pick up an Electronic Benefit Transfer Card (EBT) to receive benefits from the Supplemental Nutrition Program (SNAP) or the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program. The cards are distributed 8:15am to 4:45pm Monday - Friday.
