MAJOR DUTIES:

Implement a program-wide trauma-informed environment, supporting trauma-informed care within children and families comprehensive services. Serve as a resource to the EHS staff regarding pediatric and adult mental health. Strengthen the collaboration between EHS and the Mental Health consultants. Collaboratively build and enhance coordinated services with local substance abuse and mental health treatment programs, domestic violence service providers, disaster response programs, child welfare agencies, and others.

Ensure and assist with the development of individualized mental health plans, as needed, for children with identified concerns. Provide monthly status reports, technical support and training to center staff.

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Engage in intentional ongoing monitoring using the ChildPlus database (and other means of quality control, as necessary) to ensure that all children are growing and developing in a healthy manner.

Work closely with the early learning and family engagement specialists in supporting families to advocate for their children in the referral process of Part C (Strong Start) and Part B (Early Stages) intervention services.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Bachelor's degree in psychology, counseling, or a related field, with at least 2 years of supervisory experience. Ability to maintain confidentiality, work sensitively and effectively with individuals of diverse educational, social-economic and cultural backgrounds. Good working knowledge of MS Office (Word, Excel, Outlook and Power Point), data management systems, and the ability to use/learn electronic time-keeping program. Possess effective organizational and professional communication skills, both written and verbal.

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

Master's degree in psychology, trauma counseling, mental health, or a related field. Knowledge of trauma informed intervention strategies. Understanding of Head Start Performance Standards, and experience working in a Head Start or Early Head Start program.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS:

In the event that an offer is extended, the candidate will be required to successfully complete a criminal background check and/or FBI fingerprinting, as well as pre-employment drug screening, as applicable for the position.
